### **Core course: Integrated Skills**

With a focus on U.S. immigration and the history of Philadelphia, students explore and enhance their understanding of the current cultural diversity within the U.S. Students read academic texts, listen to lectures, participate in academic discussions, give presentations, and perform research. The culminating project is a personal blog that showcases their coursework and international experience.

## **Housing & Meals**

You must be 18 years old and have English language test scores of TOEFL iBT 40+, IELTS 5+, DET 45+, or TOEIC 400+. Students without test scores may take the online ELP Placement Test.
