  - Student must be in good standing and recommended by home university
- 3. Official transcript or grade report in English from home university
- 4. Proof of English language proficiency (minimum scores)
  - TOEFL iBT: 80 (for graduate-min. sub-score of 20 in speaking and writing)
  - IELTS: 6.5 (for graduate-no sub-score below 6.0)
  - Cambridge International Examinations: "D" (undergrad only)
- 5. Medical History and Immunization Forms
- 6. Copy of Passport
- 7. Course Request Form
- 8. On-Campus Housing Application, if desired (online after acceptance)
- 9. DS-2019 request for J-1 visa (submit upon request after acceptance)
