

Daisaku Ikeda

Profile

Born in 1928 in Tokyo.

Honorary president of Soka Gakkai and the president of the Soka Gakkai International (SGI). Ikeda has founded a number of institutions such as Soka University, Soka University of America, Soka Schools System, the Min-On Concert Association, the Tokyo Fuji Art Museum, the Institute of Oriental Philosophy, and the Toda Institute for Global Peace and Policy Research.

Ikeda has held numerous dialogues with learned individuals from around the world, helping to further movements relating to peace, culture, and education. In addition to the United Nations Peace Prize, Ikeda has received more than 380 academic honors from universities and academic institutions around the world, including Moscow State University, the University of Glasgow, the University of Denver, and Peking University, as well as numerous awards such as Poet Laureate, World People's Poet, World Poet Laureate Award, and World Peace Poet.

Ikeda has written novels such as The Human Revolution (12 volumes), The New Human Revolution (currently 30 volumes), and has also published numerous dialogues in book form. These include Choose Life: A Dialogue (with Arnold J. Toynbee), Moral Lessons of the Twentieth Century (with Mikhail Gorbachev), The Wisdom of Tolerance: A Philosophy of Generosity and Peace (with Abdurrahman Wahid), and Planetary Citizenship: Your Values, Beliefs and Actions Can Shape a Sustainable World (with Hazel Henderson).

Since its founding in 1971, Soka University has provided education as an institute that aims to be a "student-first university," upholding the founding principles put forth by founder Daisaku Ikeda.

Origins of Soka Education

In 1930, educator Tsunesaburo Makiguchi published the first volume of The System of Value Creating Pedagogy.

"Soka" in Japanese means "value creation." In essence, creating value is synonymous with enhancing life.

To persevere in the pursuit of peace also means to protect human dignity and to create value no matter what difficulties may be encountered. These are the essential ideals of Soka education, and they exist to nurture creative individuals.

The Makiguchi philosophy of respecting life was carried on by his disciple, Josei Toda. On November 16, 1950, Toda entrusted Daisaku Ikeda with the dreams of Makiguchi, and this became the philosophy upon which Soka University was founded.

"Daisaku, let's build a university. A Soka University. But this may not be possible for me to achieve during my lifetime. If that's the case, I am counting on you, Daisaku. Let's make it the best university in the world!"

Remaining true to the will of his mentor, Ikeda founded Soka University on April 2, 1971, with the aim of fulfilling the philosophy of Soka education.

Message from the President

Advocating the founding principles put forth by Daisaku Ikeda, Soka University is committed to producing "creative global citizens" who will play a leading role in ensuring peace and sustainable prosperity.

In 2021, Soka University celebrated its 50th anniversary, and launched a new long-term plan, "Soka University Grand Design 2021-2030," towards the 60th anniversary of its founding.

Under the theme of "a university that fosters 'global citizens' that can create value," we will continue to support the unleashing of each student's unlimited potential and will develop the four areas of education, research, SDGs, and diversity. A major part of this plan is the creation of a global campus. We have



received the highest "S" rating in two consecutive interim evaluations for the "Top Global University Project" adopted in 2014. We will further strengthen our efforts for the final year, 2023.

Soka University actively welcomes international students to create an educational environment in which students from many different cultural backgrounds can learn together. More than 10% of the student population comes from other countries. We also encourage Japanese students to study abroad at least once during their time at the university and invite many teachers from all over the world. Our aim is to create a truly global campus.

We will develop an international hub for humanistic education so that people from across Japan and around the world can gather and grow through friendly competition on the campus and pursue successful careers in Japan or abroad.

Our quest to become a university where each student can fulfill his or her dream continues.

Selected as a recipient of MEXT's **Top Global University Project**



Our program for producing "global citizens" who will play a leading role in ensuring peace and sustainable prosperity was selected as a recipient of the 2014 Top Global University Project of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. In this project, support from the national government focuses on universities and other institutions that are committed to partnerships with overseas universities and global researchers.

Interim evaluations of the project were released in 2018 and 2021, and the University's initiatives received an "S" rating, the highest of five ratings (S-D), for two consecutive years.

Faculty of Economics

Department of Economics



We are training true cosmopolitan citizens who can adapt to the era of globalization

The Faculty of Economics leads the internationalization of our educational environment. Students are given a solid base in foreign languages, learn economics, and acquire true communication skills that they can use in the global society of today. Employing cutting-edge learning methods, the faculty trains cosmopolitan citizens who are capable of pursuing a successful career on a global level.







International Program (IP)

This program is designed to train and equip individuals with knowledge of economics and the capacity to communicate on the global stage. In addition to specialized knowledge in economics, IP also places importance on English education, helping students acquire the skills they need to study at a university or graduate school in another country.

IP offers two training abroad programs. Prior to departure, students can attend a preparatory English course with 20 hours or more of class and, after arrival, they can visit Japanese companies and learn directly about the local economic and business-related reality, earning a global comprehension about economic matters.

Industry-Academia Collaboration and Improved Internship

We enable students to learn how the economics knowledge gained at university can be applied in society by inviting instructors from industrial circles to give lectures. In addition, students can also take part in internships in which they can apply what they have learned at Soka University. Students can also attend internship or volunteer programs in regions affected by natural disasters, contributing to local society and learning through different approaches. This is an environment for students to enrich their education through practical experience as well as theory.

From the perspective of the dignity of life, Humanistic Business Administration consists in the ideal of confronting various social issues through organizational activities, and it aims to contribute to the peace of the world and the humankind. Business Administration trains business leaders who are always in tune with the changes of the times and capable of pursuing their careers on a global level. Running an organization requires dialogue. We offer small classes that allow students to learn more actively. In this environment, students can fully realize their potential by studying in an area of business administration in which they can obtain the maximum benefit from Soka University's "culture of dialogue."







Strengthening industry-ready and practical skills

The faculty aims to equip its students with the skills needed to work as professionals. We also train individuals who contribute to their home countries, in roles from global individuals equipped with amazing linguistic skills to local government workers. One characteristic of the faculty is that many of its students have passed difficult examinations to become public accountants, tax accountants, and gain other certifications while in the university.

Active learning cultivates the skills needed in society

Through debates and fieldwork, the faculty equips students with basic abilities that are needed in society, such as communication and the skills to identify and solve problems. This helps students grow capable of independently seeking and arriving at their own unique answers to questions without a single correct answer.

Training businesspeople who also contribute to society

Based on the founder's humanistic principles, our curriculum is designed to create leaders with a high level of morality. The faculty offers case studies and other types of courses. Students also have opportunities to visit overseas universities and UN institutions to learn about good forms of business enterprise. In this way, we train world citizens who are capable of contributing to society.

Our faculties partner with top business schools around the world. We offer excellent opportunities for students to improve their knowledge and communication skills and pursue a global career by experiencing different cultures. This helps students grow more globally minded.

Department of Law



We develop and educate motivated students who view law from a global perspective

The faculty has three indexes for developing individuals: (1) individuals who stand by the people, take action for the realization of justice, and are equipped with healthy legal minds; (2) individuals who respect human rights and work with a commitment to achieving peace; and (3) agents for creating a new and humanism-based legal culture. Based on these indexes, the faculty welcomes motivated students who are strongly aware of their own career development and who will pursue a successful career on the world stage.







Diverse careers and courses

The faculty offers four different career courses to help students fulfill their dreams. The faculty actively supports students in developing their careers and acquiring many different legal certifications, primarily through the holding of workshops. This allows students to design their careers in a way that fits their goals.

The module system was established as a way to deepen learning in each theme and field across courses. Students can freely choose from seven themes and fields (modules), including human rights, international affairs, environment, and Asia, to deepen their specialized studies in that module.

Variety of international programs

The Faculty of Law also offers programs to students who aim to acquire a global career overseas, such as a unique exchange program with the University of Oslo.

Exploring a Theme - Module System Industry-academia collaboration programs

This problem-solving project, organized in collaboration with companies such as Nomura Securities Co., Ltd., offers a case method-type workshop. In the program, students acquire the abilities to identify and solve problems in society, the ability to learn on their own, and interpersonal skills. Students can also improve their skills for pursuing a career.

The objective of education in the Faculty of Letters is to develop and educate creative individuals who are truly well-rounded scholars. The faculty helps students obtain linguistic skills to spread their wings worldwide by learning Japanese, English, Chinese, Russian and other languages; gain the cultural ability to meticulously learn philosophy, history, literature, and other disciplines; discover ways to view things from their own perspective and express them in their own unique way; and acquire the specialized ability to accurately understand and evaluate what is happening in the ever-changing world.







Twelve doors to open your future

The faculty offers 12 optional majors for students to improve their abilities to express themselves, which enables them to independently design and pave the way for their futures. Students take common core courses in their first year and decide their major in the second year, after which they begin studying in their area of specialization.

AKADEMIA Major

The AKADEMIA major, which is taught in English, will begin in the Academic Year of 2023. Based on the philosophy of Soka Education, students will study philosophy, anthropology, and peace studies to develop human resources that will contribute to world peace and human happiness.

Chance to earn degrees from two different universities within a four-year period

The double degree (DD) course allows students to spend two years attending courses at the University of Buckingham, in England.

Students earn two different degrees, one from the University of Buckingham and the other from the Soka University Faculty of Law.

Faculty of Education

Department of Education / Department of Primary Education



We produce educators who stand at the forefront of humanistic education and possess an abundance of humanistic abilities

Based on the founding principles, the Faculty of Education conducts education and academic research throughout all areas from primary, secondary, and tertiary education to social education and lifelong education. The Faculty of Education has two departments: Department of Education and Department of Primary Education tion. At the Department of Education, the disciplines and researches are centered on not only education but also clinical educational psychology. At the Department of Primary Education involves mainly training early childhood and juvenile education teachers and also researches on special education.







Education from the perspective of Pedagogy and Psychology

In both departments, we reexamine education from the perspective of Pedagogy and Psychology, and learn in practice the concept of humanistic education. In the Department of Education, we provide teacher-training courses for junior high school as well as courses aimed for the acquisition of a licensed psychologist qualification. In the Department of Primary Education, students can select teacher-training courses for kindergarten, elementary school and special needs school.

Improving the skills with active learning method classes

In the "Schooling Case Studies" classes that are available from the 2nd year, students are divided into groups and research about the issues that can be encountered at the environment of the schools and work together to find the solutions for them. In "School Internship" classes, students learn in practice more about the occupation of a teacher by going once in a week to elementary and junior high schools during the semester.

Announcement about the qualifications and school teaching certificate

At the Faculty of Education, it is not possible to acquire the certificate of Japanese language teacher. In case you plan to acquire this certificate please select the Faculty of Letters. Also, for the course for the acquisition of a licensed psychologist qualification has a limited number of students and in order to proceed to the 2nd year, there will be a selection based on an analysis of the student's transcript of records and an interview test. Transferred students (from 3rd year) cannot participate in the program.

Develop expertise in small-group seminars

From the 3rd year, small-groups seminars are organized and students acquire expertise by doing researches with the same professor for 2 years.

Divided into two departments, the Department of Information Systems Engineering and the Department of Science and Engineering for Sustainable Innovation, the faculty allows students to study specialized areas and develops and educates individuals who have high aspirations and contribute to the public welfare of humankind.







Department of Information Systems Engineering

With many different courses such as AI and data science, mathematical sciences, computer system security, VR and robotics, the Department offers a robust environment for research and helps students extend their technical skills and abilities to come up with good ideas. We develop and educate individuals who represent the next generation of leaders in the information society.

Introducing active and problem-solving forms of learning

The faculty introduces project studies, case studies, and other programs for proactively solving problems. Learning here is more than just attending lectures or experiments. We research, analyze, and verify the same subjects together, hold in-depth discussions, and work together to find solutions.

Department of Science and Engineering for Sustainable Innovation

We develop and educate global leaders who will contribute to the prosperity of humankind and international society

The faculty develops and educates global citizens who take personal responsibility for the challenges facing humankind and strive to make a positive contribution to resolving them. In order to achieve these goals, students acquire five primary abilities: 1) academic knowledge across multiple disciplines 2) academic English skills to be used in a global capacity 3) cross-cultural perspectives and communication skills 4) a desire to strive for peace and prosperity, 5) critical-thinking and creative problem-solving skills from an interdisciplinary perspective







All students are required to spend one semester abroad

The faculty requires all students to spend one semester abroad in the first semester of 2nd year to gain awareness of global citizenship and international mindedness early on in their academic careers. Study abroad will help students acquire academic English and cross-cultural understanding.

All classes are conducted in English

All courses in this faculty are conducted in English, enabling students to acquire a high level of proficiency so that they can "negotiate with the world." By cultivating students' global perspective, interdisciplinary academic knowledge, and practical application skills, the faculty seeks to develop and educate global individuals who can extend their influence across the globe.

Experiencing an interdisciplinary approach to social issues

While placing importance on improving linguistic and expressive abilities, the faculty exposes students to a broad range of disciplines such as history/culture, international relations/politics, and economics/business administration. This interdisciplinary approach to the curriculum enables students to solve problems and explore questions from a variety of academic perspectives.

Extensive guidance

With small classes of around 20 students, the faculty offers discussions, exploration-type learning, groupwork, and other educational activities that encourage a high level of student participation. The faculty strives to develop and educate competent and responsible individuals who are capable of making balanced decisions and take into account the risks and benefits to others and the burden to future generations.




Graduate School of Education

International students receive solid educational support

To address diverse needs—including the advancement of international students to higher academic careers in Japan and helping them improve their Japanese language skills—we offer Japanese language programs such as the Bekka Preparatory Japanese Language Program and the Undergraduate Non-degree Program for international students to learn the language and culture. There are also specialized undergraduate courses, given in Japanese and English, and programs for taking common core courses.



Bekka Preparatory Japanese Language Program

The Bekka Preparatory Japanese Language Program is focused on students willing to enter the Faculty of Economics, Faculty of Business Administration, Faculty of Law, Faculty of Letters, Faculty of Education or Faculty of Science and Engineering and need to attain Japanese proficiency beforehand. Based on their Japanese level, students learn the language for one year and are able to reach the necessary to enroll in a undergraduate program.

Undergraduate Non-degree Program

International students willing to take undergraduate courses at Soka University can apply to this program, which also offers classes on Japanese language and the opportunity to take undergraduate courses in Japanese or English based on the students' language comprehension. Candidates can apply for one or two semesters.






