In the event that the number of applicants exceeds the course capacity, we will be using a lottery system to determine the enrolled students, which may result in some students being unable to register for their desired course.

Health Insurance	All international student who stays in Japan for more than three months must enroll in the National Health Insurance System. This system covers 70% of the medical expenses in Japan and is covered by the government. Exchange students can receive assistance with the application after their arrival in Nagasaki. National Health Insurance coverage begins from the registration date as a resident in Nagasaki City. Therefore, it is strongly recommended to obtain overseas travel insurance that covers the first few days after arrival in Nagasaki, starting from the departure date.
