	STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM	JAPANESE LANGUAGE AND CULTURE PROGRAM (JLCP)
Program Outline	One semester/year program where the students apply for our Faculty/School relevant to their study/research fields at their home universities. Our undergraduate schools offer lectures (credit-able) and our graduate school offers research guidance (non-credit). Our graduate schools do not provide lectures (credited-courses) for the exchange students. Applicants are only able to apply for the same academic level as in their home universities: ex., graduate level applicants must apply to graduate level at NU.	One semester/year program for the students at our partner universities who wish to learn Japanese language and culture. Participants will be classified by the level of their Japanese language proficiency which is determined by the result of the placement test. Participants of this program are expected to take 7 credit hours per semester.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Language Program	<p>Non-credit Japanese language program is available for participants of the Student Exchange Program. The level is varied from elementary to advance. The result of a placement test determines the language level.</p> <p>In the event that the number of applicants exceeds the course capacity, we will be using a lottery system to determine the enrolled students, which may result in some students being unable to register for their desired course.</p>
Tutorship System	<p>Tutors will be allocated to the Student Exchange Program students in order to make their life at NU easy and comfortable.</p>

Visa	<p>Exchange students must obtain a student visa. Please apply for a student visa at the nearest Embassy/Consulate of Japan where you live. For visa application, you need to have the Certificate of Eligibility, which NU will send to the partner university. The</p>
Health Insurance	<p>All international student who stays in Japan for more than three months must enroll in the National Health Insurance System. This system covers 70% of the medical expenses in Japan and is covered by the government. Exchange students can receive assistance with the application after their arrival in Nagasaki. National Health Insurance coverage begins from the registration date as a resident in Nagasaki City. Therefore, it is strongly recommended to obtain overseas travel insurance that covers the first few days after arrival in Nagasaki, starting from the departure date.</p>
