- Online application.
- Passport.
- English Language Requirements. Non-native English speakers must meet one of the *minimum* requirements: IELTS Band Score 6.5, Duolingo 105 or TOELF iBT 80. Students who score less than 100 on the TOEFL iBT or Band 7.0 on the IELTS must take an additional proficiency test or ELI class upon arrival.
- Official Transcripts.
- Official transcript must have at least 24 College credits with 2 semesters of college grades on for both semesters on the transcript.

- Go to the International Exchanges Website at <u>http://internationalexchanges.pitt.edu/apply</u>. Select the correct campus and begin the correct application.
- Create an account as new user and when completing the User Registration be sure to select your home institution from the drop-down list. <u>Remember to write down your password</u>. Note, "First Name" indicates your given name, whereas "Last Name" indicates your family name.

- 5. Fill out the *Incoming Exchange Application*. This requests information on your status, area of study and housing preference. At the end of each questionnaire, you have the option to "Save" or "Done." **Questionnaires are not considered complete and cannot be reviewed until you click "Submit" to finalize your responses.**
- 6. Fill out the *Incoming Exchange Course Selection* Questionnaire. This is particularly important for Engineering, CBA, and SCI students but unnecessary for Arts and Sciences students. This asks about your course *preferences*. Be sure to list ten courses that you may be interested in registering for at Pitt. Include both the course number and title. **This does not register you for the courses**, but informs the academic area of your intentions and interests.
- 7. Fill out the *Incoming Exchange English Language Test* Questionnaire. If you have completed an IELTS or TOEFL exam, you will be prompted to upload your scores.
- 8. Fill out the Incoming Exchange Passport Information Questionnaire. You will upload the appropriate passport information.
- 9. Fill out the *Incoming Exchange Transcripts* Questionnaire. You will upload a copy of your transcript.
- 10. When all 5 sections are complete, you will find each listed under the "completed requirements" section including the date you submitted the questionnaire.
- 11. Fill out the *Profile* section. This requests information on your permanent address and emergency contacts. Do not include your campus address until you have confirmed your accommodations in Pittsburgh.

If applying to C Engineering (SSOE), or Computer and Information Science (SCI) you must already have those majors a have taken courses in the subject area. Medical School, Dental School, Law School, and Nursing School are not part of the exchange. 	
Full-time Enrollment	Incoming international exchange students must maintain full-time enrollment (at least 12 credit hours). At Pitt, this is typically 4 courses (each at 3 credit hours). Students are not to exceed 16 credit hours. Since courses are not guaranteed, it is recommended that students submit at least ten courses while applying to ensure full-time status.	
Registration	Course registration occurs after matriculation. Students will use PeopleSoft to register, working with the exchange program manager, the Director of International Engineering Initiatives (engineering students) or a specified academic advisor from the College of Business Administration (business students). Transcripts	Students will fill out the Transcript Release Form online after admission. Transcripts <u>will not</u> be mailed to student residences. Personal electronic or hardcopies may be ordered for a small fee of \$6 - <u>http://www.registrar.pitt.edu/transcripts.html</u> . Students must fill this out in order for the transcript to be sent to their home University.
